
Books for Supporting Phonological Awareness

Though ANY book can be used to create a phonological awareness lesson, the books listed below are designed to play with the sounds of speech and with rhyming words. Read the book through without interruption with your child first, and then go back into the text and review the words that rhyme, or the words that start with the same first sound, etc. Play games with your child to see if you both can come up with other words that rhyme or other words that start with the same sound as those highlighted in the books.
